Responsibilities: The Director of Case Management Program is responsible for providing leadership and management for a case management program. This includes initial and on-going development and implementation of a comprehensive case management program for individual students; providing leadership in the coordination of internal and external care and services for individual students at risk; facilitating the development and implementation of University policies, procedures, and practices with regard to students at risk; management and oversight of records and files; and serving as a resource, trainer, and consultant to faculty, staff and students. The Director will work in close collaboration with departments and programs across the University community and key community agencies to deliver services and programs to students, faculty, and staff. This position has responsibility for designing and implementing a comprehensive outreach program that includes educational materials, training and consultation to faculty, staff, students, and external stakeholders. The Director will serve on University and division committees, task forces as well as serving on the Behavioral Intervention Team. The Director will provide direct supervision to graduate students and interns as well as manage the program budget.

Qualifications and Experience: Required: Master's degree in social work or related field from a regionally accredited program. LCSW, LICSW, or LISW licensure or eligible for licensure in their respective field. Minimum of 3 years experience. Post-master's experience providing case management services to a diverse mental health population in a clinical setting; professional experience working with young adults.
