

The University of Tennessee at Martin Clinical Coordinator

Position Description:

The Clinical Coordinator is responsible for providing psychotherapy (primarily individual, with some group, and couples), outreach, program development, crisis intervention, and consultation services to the university community. The preferred candidate will be able to provide assessment, counseling and psychotherapy to university students. The Clinical Coordinator reports to the Director of the Office of Student Health and Counseling Services, and provides oversight of the day to day counseling services. The Clinical Coordinator position is a twelve (12) month position. Duties include maintaining accurate documentation, and assisting with the development and implementation of departmental goals and objectives. The position requires some evening work and some travel to the four extended campuses to provide counseling services.

Qualifications:

Preferred qualifications include Psy.D. or Ph.D. in Clinical or Counseling Psychology and licensed as a Psychologist with Health Service Provider designation in Tennessee. Minimum qualifications include a Master's in Clinical or Counseling Psychology or related field, licensed as a Mental Health Practitioner in Tennessee. The successful candidate must demonstrate an appreciation for this position and be able to work within our office environment, so as to promote a healthy working environment conducive to the smooth operation of our service.

Experience:

Three years of experience working with college students as a psychologist / counselor in a comparable or similar setting is ideal. Salary range is commensurate with education and experience.

Position begins August 1, 2009. Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled.
